WHAT?



Lord Leverhulme was born on 19th September 1851 he died on 7 May 1925



Initially the son of a grocer, he set up a soap factory called 'Lever Brothers' and manufactured Sunlight Soap in Port Sunlight on the Wirral.



During the industrial revolution, working conditions were poor, many men, women and children worked for long periods of time in terrible conditions.



Leverhulme realised the importance of looking after his workers and he build his workers a town to live in with excellent amenities such as a dining hall, allotments, swimming pool and
